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1. Introduction





In 2023, a group of young people from Genuine Partnerships and Guiding Voices came together to discus Employment. The young people said they wanted to hold an event about employment, but to be able to work, they also needed to know about many other things. These included Health, Housing, and Community Inclusion. Young people said they would like this to be called the Futures Fair and they would like one event in each area of South Yorkshire. South Yorkshire ICB gave some funding for an event to Employment is for Everyone to help facilitate this.

At the same time, Doncaster Council was working on their Supported Internships Programme and wished to host an event for young people with SEND to showcase the different employment opportunities available across Doncaster.

Doncaster Council and Employment is for Everyone came together to organise the Futures Fair. Clair Dawson, SEND Enterprise Co-ordinator Project Lead for Doncaster Council, and the DMBC Skills Team, led on the event with support from Employment is for Everyone.

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1. Introduction

Together we worked with partners and organisations across Doncaster and South Yorkshire to ensure we had the right representation for young people on the day.

The event was held on the 18th of September at Doncaster Eco Power Stadium. The whole day was based on what young people had told us was important.

Young people in Doncaster helped to shape the running order and structure of the day. The event started at IPM and finished at 6PM, so that people could attend either with school, or with their family or supporters later in the day. This was to help ensure as many people as possible could attend. This report shares the feedback from the day.



2. What happend on the day?

The event was separated into different zones based on the feedback from children and young people:

- 1. Employment
- 2. Housing
- 3. Community Inclusion
- 4. Health
- 5. Education

Each zone was given the questions that young people wanted answering at the event.

Everyone attending the event had the opportunity to join workshops on the topics above these were delivered by partners including, NHS England, NSPCC, Peer Support Workers (Speakup) and the DWP. People could also listen to mini talks or find out more information from the market stalls. The mini talks included presentations from:

- Employment is for Everyone
- Sheffield University
- Amazon
- DFN Project Search
- Apprenticeships
- Local Supported Employment
- National Development Team for Inclusion.

3. People told us they enjoyed

Over 500 people attended the day, people had a range of ways to tell us their views. Some people filled out questionnaires and others were filmed on the day. 29 people filled in the questionnaire.
